The challenge: Manually editing, formatting, and numbering

Like so many organizations today, dinHMS-gruppen relied on manual processes and Word to manage content and achieve consistency in and across their business-critical documents.

File sharing wastes time and opportunities

Version tracking issues and problems compiling multiple formats and parts into one consistent document often result in caffeine-fueled all-nighters to meet deadlines.

Unsurprisingly, this check-in/check-out system hampered their ability to do so. They were battling version control, and hassling with formatting layers and numbering. It all added up to wasted time and undue risk.

Lillebø explains:

- With Word, we had to break the document into subdocuments, assigning responsibilities to each part. This lead to a fragmented and serial production process. Co-authors didn't really work on the same document in real time. Each person had to work on it one at a time and then email it to the next person in line, so that they could do their part. This made it hard to keep track of the original content and manage This was the case for dinHMS-gruppen, as well.

- Using Word to create our proposals and other business-critical documents didn't enable us to simultaneously assign roles and responsibilities to individual members of our team. Pulling an all-nighter the day before submitting the proposal was no rare occurrence...

File sharing can lead to expensive mistakes, and wasted business opportunities. For dinHMS-gruppen. using Word not only wasted precious time, it tended to steal the focus every proposal team needs to be able to put together a winning proposal.

Consequently, dinHMS-gruppen realized they needed a different, more strategic and secure tendering process.

This is exactly the point where project managers begin to lose control and encounter the dreaded time vacuum of manually editing, formatting, and numbering.

Getting all those stubborn tables to sit straight, composing the images and graphs, adjusting the table of contents, checking the bulleting and numbering. It's a pain.

Then, towards the end of the process, the person responsible for compiling the document needs to collate a variety of files, generate the document, and ensure that the formatting and layout is consistent.

- The various sub-documents being handed in by our contributors were inconsistent in terms of fonts, layout, numbering, everything, and we had to do

- One of our major clients told us about this proposal tool during an executive training program. We took a closer look at the solution, and immediately knew this was what we needed to solve our proposal process issues.



The benefits of reusing content

As any proposal team manager knows, the fastest way to produce bids and proposals is to rely upon, reference, and reuse pieces of optimised content. XaitPorter has allowed dinHMS to do just that – easily reuse pre-approved and vetted content across multiple documents.

- Each time we created a proposal using Word, we would spend a lot of time manually searching for past content. Then, manually adjusting names and details in templates or fighting with formatting and numbering as we correlated.

Leveraging an immediately available and reusable content repository has removed these process inefficiencies.

Results: Consistent quality output

Fussing with Word formatting issues and serial processes were key drivers behind dinHMS-gruppen's decision to move to a solution that kills the complexity of creating large business documents. Has using XaitPorter simplified their proposal management process?

- Absolutely. On the one hand, getting everything into an all-in-one platform, with a joint layout and design, makes everything look more professional. On the other, the solution makes it easier to operate at different geographic locations. We can easily delegate tasks to the right people for each section, and assign deadlines. And even though we are located in different cities, everyone can work on the same document at the same time, from wherever they are. The result is clearly defined responsibilities, and a streamlined process. Nowadays, we can easily access and select various process descriptions to reuse in our next proposal.
This saves us a lot of time and energy.

Lillebø continues:


- Today, for instance, a client approached us, wondering if we were able to retrieve a revised proposal submitted a year ago. We simply logged onto Porter, selected it, and shared it with them. Simple as that. The client actually pointed out how quickly we were able to deliver it. "You're obiously well organized." In the past, content was dispersed across emails, PCs and folders here and there. Today, everything is in one place, ready made.

Demonstrable return on investment

Since adopting XaitPorter, it's safe to say dinHMSgruppen is pleased with their results. The organization as a whole is better able to manage the creation, maintenance and application of content across their live documents.
